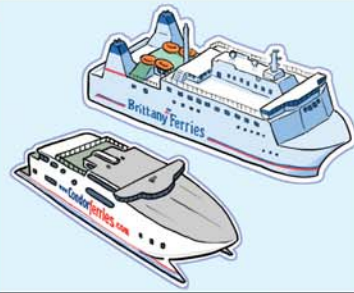

Navigation marks, such as buoys, guide ships safely into the harbour. They are marked on charts and lit so that ships can follow the channels even at night and in the fog.

CARGO SHIP

Ships, carrying over 400,000 tonnes of steel, timber, grain, sand and gravel are loaded and unloaded at Poole every year. Imports and exports through Poole help the local economy.

SURVEY ONE

The harbour channels must be dredged to keep them deep enough for ships to come safely into the Port. Sand and mud is constantly being moved around the harbour by waves and the tide, eventually settling on the seabed. Survey One checks the harbour depth.
