

UKOPRA Poole Bay Classic Powerboat Event 2022 (amended)

Sunday 12th June 2022

This notice is issued by Poole Harbour Commissioners on behalf of UKOPRA.

Mariners are advised that the UKOPRA Poole Bay Classic Powerboat Event will take place on Sunday 12th June 2022.

Sunday - Race 1 – 10:00

Up to 11 ThunderCats (small inflatable catamaran boats capable of up to 40 knots) will complete a 5 lap course within Poole Bay, starting from Bournemouth Pier, traveling in a clockwise direction, taking all turn marks to starboard.

Sunday - Race 2 – 12:00

Up to 15 Offshore Powerboats ranging from 19ft / 35 knots to 60ft / 80+ knots, will complete a multi-lap course within Poole Bay extending to Western Solent Approaches. Starting from Bournemouth Pier and traveling in a clockwise direction, taking all turn marks to starboard, with the exception of Hengistbury Head buoy (G) and the Peveril Ledge buoy (N), both to be taken to port.

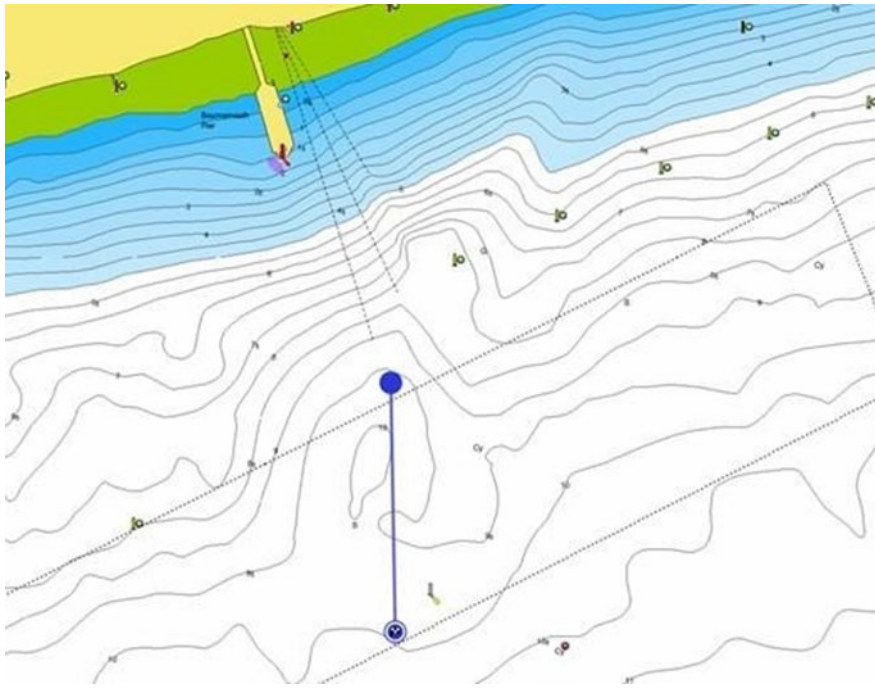
Operations / Race Management

Race Control will be at Poole Quay Hotel. On water operations will be coordinated by 'Safety Control' from a shore side unit located on East Overcliff Drive (Bournemouth), contactable on VHF Channel M1 / 37a. Race Officials will operate from the two sites throughout the event. There will be two races held on Sunday 12th June:

Starts Procedures

Competing vessels will depart Poole Quay at 09:00 and 10:00, in low-speed convoy out of Poole Harbour towards Bournemouth Pier, to 'Muster' South-West of Alum Outfall Buoy. The start boat will collect each fleet from the Muster area, running East towards the yellow buoy south of Bournemouth Pier.

All spectator vessels are strongly advised to keep well north of the yellow Bournemouth Pier buoy and equivalent along the coastline to Boscombe Pier.

Offshore Classe 3 - Start Lap A, Lap C, Lap C, Lap B, Lap C, Lap B (clockwise) - 63.1nm

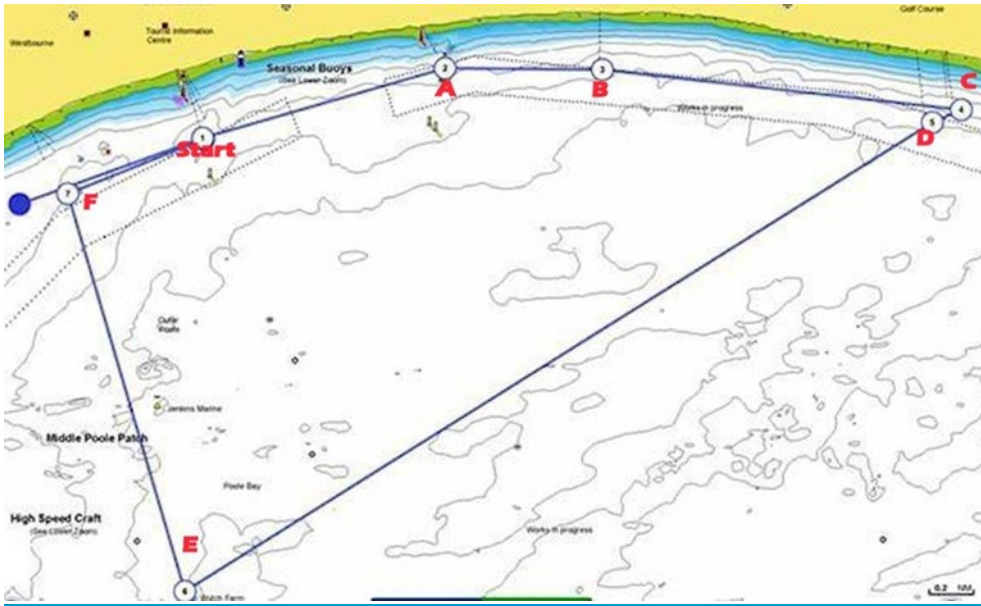


Figure 3 - Lap B

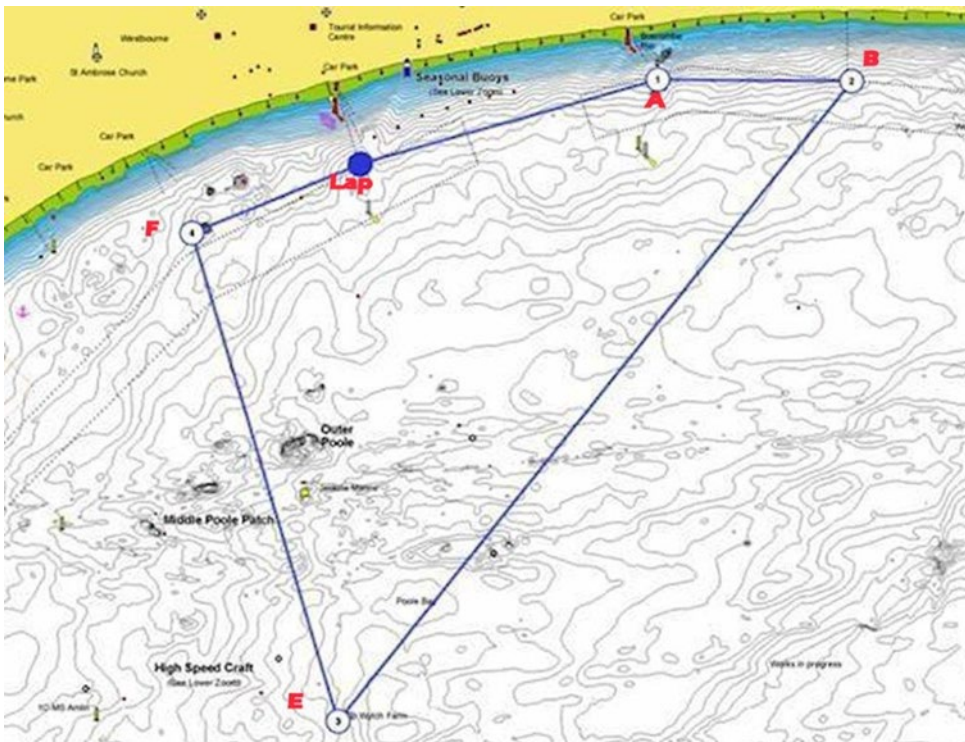
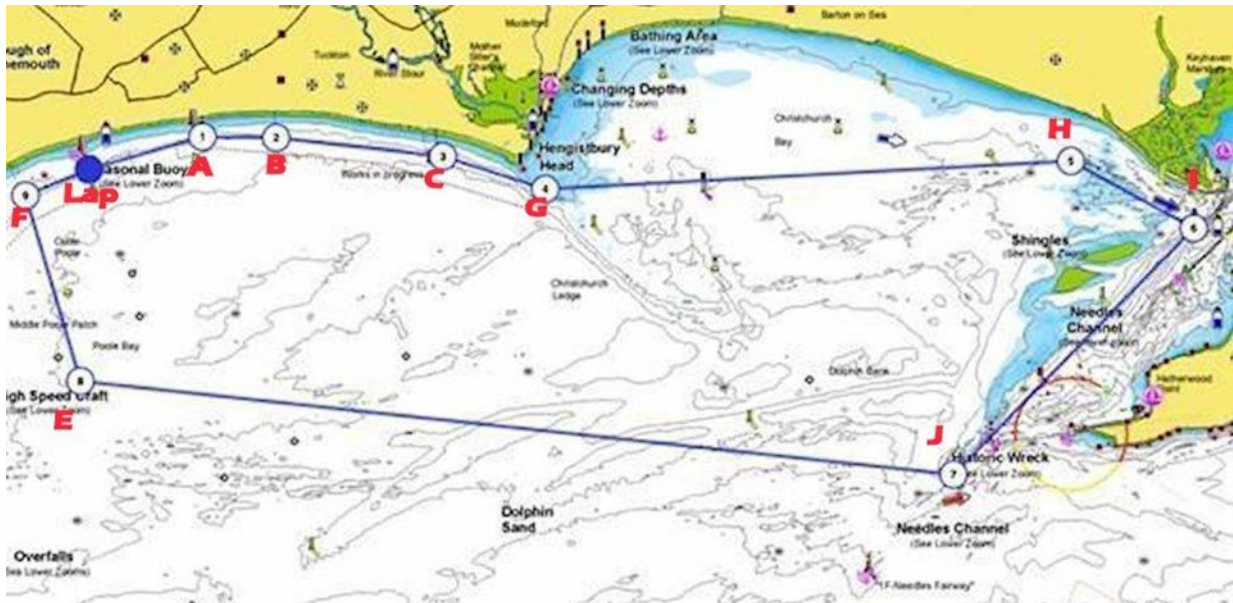


Figure 6 - Lap E**Finish**

The finish will be at the lap line south of Bournemouth Pier. The latest estimated finish times are 11:45 and 14:00.

Spectator Craft

These are high-speed races taking place in a potentially busy area within Poole Bay and the approaches to the Western Solent. In the interests of safety, all craft not participating are advised to keep well clear of the start / finish area. Vessels should proceed with caution and be aware of their surroundings and nearby vessels whilst navigating in or near to the areas of racing. They should take heed of the advice from Race Marshall / Support vessels who will all be displaying a white 'UKOPRA' marshal flag.

Race Marshal Patrol Boats

Marshals will patrol the racing area.

International Regulations for the Prevention of Collisions at Sea (1972) as amended takes precedence over all other considerations.
